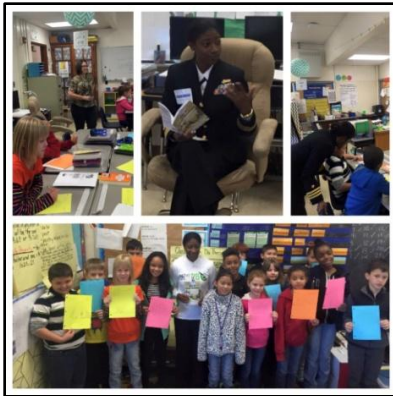

Reading Programs:



This past fall, Ebony Eyes conducted several reading programs at Buder Elementary located in South St. Louis City and ASA Academy located in North St. Louis County. The theme for the year was –

Show Me Famous Missourians. Students learned about Langston Hughes, Maya Angelou, Mark Twain and Walt Disney. They read several poems by Langston Hughes, that focused on the importance of having dreams, Maya Angelou, that focused on having confidence in yourself and your abilities, and excerpts by Mark Twain, highlighting to students the importance of using their voice to describe their environment and the world around them. The children - in turn - created poems, short stories or memes about their dreams, talents, self confidence and how they can impact their community. Their writings were compiled into a class book titled ... We Are The Next Generation of Famous Missourians: Using Our Voice to Declare Our Dreams - WE WILL BE GREAT!
